

GOLF CANADA RULES GOVERN ALL PLAY EXCEPT WHERE LOCAL RULES PREVAIL

1. Boundary fences and white stakes mark Out of Bounds.
2. Yellow Stakes – Water hazard (use Golf Canada rules).
3. Red Stakes – Lateral water hazard (use Golf Canada rules).
4. Cart paths, immovable obstructions, staked trees, sprinkler heads, and yardage markers: free drop, one club length, no closer to the hole.
5. All Ground Under Repair (G.U.R.): free drop, no closer to the hole.
6. Natural grass areas may be elected to play as lateral hazards. One stroke penalty, drop nearest point of entry.
7. Natural grass areas along left side of 17 and 18 are considered environmentally sensitive areas. Golfers are prohibited from searching for balls in these areas. Lateral Hazard rules are still in effect. For possible lost balls hit from the 17th or 18th tee boxes that do not cross a lateral hazard proceed as follows. Use rule #6 if it crosses into these grasses. If it goes straight into these grasses, please proceed to drop area provided near 150 yard marker for 17 and near the 200 marker for 18. Add 1 penalty stroke.

GENERAL RULES

1. Soft spikes only.
2. No carts in natural grasses (tall fescue grass).
3. Please replace divots or use divot mix, rake sand traps and repair ball marks.
4. All balls out of bounds are lost. Boundary fences border private property.
5. Keep all carts on the cart paths where cart paths are available.
6. All Alberta Gaming & Liquor Commission regulations apply and are strictly enforced.
7. Balls striking power lines must be replayed (re-tee, no penalty).
8. Waste bunkers on Holes 11 and 13 are played as such. Club may be grounded and shot repair is not necessary. Rakes are not provided.
9. We are a cart mandatory golf course.

ETIQUETTE

1. Maintain pace of play. Always keep up to the group in front of you. Try to play your round in 4.5 hours or less. Let players through if your group is having difficulty.
2. Ball searches in natural grass areas must be limited to 2 minutes. See Local Rule 6 above.
3. Respect the player assistants and course signage at all times.
4. Please keep carts away from tees, greens, sand traps and water hazards.
5. Please respect the golf course, staff, other players and the community.
6. Golfers are responsible for any damages caused to golf carts or golf course during their visit.
